1.1. Programme Outcomes (POs)

B.A. Anthropology is a Four-year (eight semesters) programme of credits including major courses, minor courses, multidisciplinary courses, skills enhancement courses, value added courses and ability enhancement courses. In each semester, the students will be offered theory and practical courses.

Those who complete a one (1) year will be awarded UG certificate, two (2) years will be awarded UG diploma of study, three years (3) will be awarded a bachelor's degree and four (4) years will be awarded an Under Graduate Honours/Honours with Research Degree in Anthropology.
